AN ACT

To amend the Communications Act of 1934 to authorize, in certain cases, the issuance of licenses to noncitizens for radio stations on aircraft and for the operation thereof.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That section 303 (1) of the Communications Act of 1934
4 is amended by inserting immediately before the semicolon
5 at the end thereof the following: “, except that in issuing
6 licenses for the operation of radio stations on aircraft the
7 Commission may, if it finds that the public interest will be
8 served ~~thereby and that security considerations have been~~
9 ~~satisfied,~~ *thereby,* waive the requirement of citizenship in the
10 case of persons holding United States pilot certificates ~~issued~~

1 by the ~~Civil Aeronautics Administration~~, or in the case of
2 persons holding foreign aircraft pilot certificates which are
3 valid in the United States on the basis of reciprocal agree-
4 ments entered into with foreign governments”.

5 SEC. 2. Subsection (a) of section 310 of the Communi-
6 cations Act of 1934 is amended by adding at the end thereof
7 the following new paragraph:

8 “Notwithstanding paragraph (1) of this subsection, a
9 license for a radio station on an aircraft may be granted
10 to and held by a person who is an alien or a representative
11 of an alien if such person holds a United States pilot cer-
12 tificate issued by the ~~Civil Aeronautics Administration~~ or a
13 foreign aircraft pilot certificate which is valid in the United
14 States on the basis of reciprocal agreements entered into
15 with foreign governments.”

2 sons holding foreign aircraft pilot certificates which are
3 valid in the United States on the basis of reciprocal agree-
4 ments entered into with foreign governments”.

5 SEC. 2. Subsection (a) of section 310 of the Communi-
6 cations Act of 1934 is amended by adding at the end thereof
7 the following new paragraph:

8 “Notwithstanding paragraph (1) of this subsection, a
9 license for a radio station on an aircraft may be granted
