WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON VERIZON PETITION FOR LIMITED WAIVER OF CALL SIGNALING RULES

On February 10, 2012, Verizon¹ filed a petition seeking a limited waiver of the Commission's call signaling rules² adopted in the *USF/ICC Transformation Order*.³ In its petition, Verizon requests "a waiver of the new phantom traffic rules to enable Verizon to complete its compliance assessment, develop remediation plans, and seek further waivers as appropriate, and a limited waiver of the new phantom traffic rules with respect to (1) certain SS7 network elements; (2) multi-frequency (MF) signaling equipment; and (3) originating/intermediate carrier IP traffic exchanges."⁴

Interested parties may file **comments on or before March 19, 2012**, and **reply comments on or before April 3, 2012**. All pleadings are to reference **CC Docket Nos. 01-92, 96-45; GN Docket No. 09-51; WC Docket Nos. 03-109, 05-337, 07-135, 10-90; WT Docket No. 10-208**. This Public Notice establishes certain procedural requirements relating to consideration of the Verizon Petition. This matter shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.⁶ Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentations and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one- or two-sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.⁷ Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.⁸
