As you note, in 1991, Congress enacted the Telephone Consumer Protection Act (TCPA) to protect consumers from unwanted autodialed or prerecorded telemarketing calls. The statute and the Commission's implementing rules prohibit the use of automatic telephone dialing systems and artificial or prerecorded voice messages to make non-emergency calls without prior express consent to, among others, any mobile telephone service number.

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Please be assured that we will take into consideration the issues and concerns presented by all stakeholders as the Commission reviews the record in this proceeding as expeditiously as possible.
