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COMMENTS INVITED ON APPLICATION OF AT&T SERVICES, INC. ON BEHALF OF AT&T CORP. TO DISCONTINUE INTERCONNECTED VOIP SERVICES

On **November 18, 2014**, **AT&T Services, Inc.** (AT&T or Applicant) filed an application with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC or Commission) on behalf of its affiliate, **AT&T Corp.**, located at **One AT&T Way, Bedminster, NJ 07921-0752**, requesting authority, under section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 214, and section 63.71 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, to discontinue certain interconnected Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) services throughout its territory in Connecticut (Service Area).¹

AT&T indicates that AT&T Corp. currently offers AT&T Voice DNA® for Small Business service (Affected Service) in the Service Area. AT&T describes the Affected Service as a hosted interconnected VoIP service serving small business sites with a minimum of 1 and a maximum of 20 stations over AT&T High Speed Internet Service. AT&T states, however, that its ILEC affiliate, Southern New England Telephone Company, no longer provides the High Speed Internet Service used to provide the Affected Service following the sale of its assets in Connecticut to Frontier Communications. Consequently, AT&T explains that it currently provides the Affected Service to customers using Internet service provided by Frontier. AT&T indicates, however, that it now intends to discontinue the Affected Service in the Service Area on or after January 6, 2015, subject to Commission authorization. AT&T maintains that the public convenience and necessity will not be impaired by the proposed discontinuance because there are alternative services available. According to AT&T, there is a competitive market for Hosted interconnected VoIP service for small businesses in Connecticut. In addition, AT&T submits that AT&T Business Ready is a substitute service which does not rely on AT&T's High Speed Internet Service and is available for all existing customers of the Affected Service in Connecticut. AT&T states that AT&T Corp. notified its customers of the proposed discontinuance by letters sent via overnight delivery on November 14, 2014. AT&T asserts that AT&T Corp. is considered a non-dominant carrier with respect to the Affected Service.

In accordance with section 63.71(c) of the Commission's rules, AT&T's application will be deemed to be granted automatically on the 31st day after the release date of this public notice, unless the Commission notifies AT&T that the grant will not be automatically effective. In the application, AT&T indicates that AT&T Corp. plans to discontinue the Affected Service in the Service Area on or after January 6, 2015, subject to Commission authorization. Accordingly, pursuant to section 63.71(c) and the

terms of the application, absent further Commission action, AT&T Corp. may discontinue its AT&T Voice DNA® for Small Business service in the Service Area on or after **January 9, 2015**, in accordance with AT&T's filed representations. The Commission normally will authorize proposed discontinuances of service unless it is shown that customers or other end users would be unable to receive service or a reasonable substitute from another carrier, or that the public convenience and necessity would be otherwise adversely affected.

Comments objecting to this application must be filed with the Commission on or before **December 24, 2014**. Such comments should refer to **WC Docket No. 14-249 and Comp. Pol. File No. 1197**. Comments should include specific information about the impact of this proposed discontinuance on the commenter, including any inability to acquire reasonable substitute service. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) or by filing paper copies. *See Electronic Filing of Documents in Rulemaking Proceedings*, 63 FR 24121 (1998). Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the ECFS: <http://fjallfoss.fcc.gov/ecfs2/>. Filers should follow the instructions provided on the Web site for submitting comments. Generally, only one copy of an electronic submission must be filed. In completing the transmittal screen, filers should include their full name, U.S. Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking number.

Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and one copy of each filing. Filings can be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail. All filings must be addressed to the Commission's Secretary, Office of the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission. All hand-delivered or messenger-delivered paper filings for the Commission's Secretary must be delivered to FCC Headquarters at 445 12th Street, S.W., Room TW-A325, Washington, D.C. 20554. The filing hours are Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. All hand deliveries must be held together with rubber bands or fasteners. Any envelopes and boxes must be disposed of before entering the building. Commercial overnight mail (other than U.S. Postal Service Express Mail and Priority Mail) must be sent to 9300 East Hampton Drive, Capitol Heights, MD 20743. U.S. Postal Service first-class, Express, and Priority mail must be addressed to 445 12th Street, S.W., Washington, D.C. 20554.

This proceeding is considered a "permit but disclose" proceeding for purposes of the Commission's *ex parte* rules.² Persons making *ex parte* presentations must file a copy of any written presentation or a memorandum summarizing any oral presentation within two business days after the presentation (unless a different deadline applicable to the Sunshine period applies). Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must (1) list all persons attending or otherwise participating in the meeting at which the *ex parte* presentation was made, and (2) summarize all data presented and arguments made during the presentation. If the presentation consisted in whole or in part of the presentation of data or arguments already reflected in the presenter's written comments, memoranda or other filings in the proceeding, the presenter may provide citations to such data or arguments in his or her prior comments, memoranda, or other filings (specifying the relevant page and/or paragraph numbers where such data or arguments can be found) in lieu of summarizing them in the memorandum. Documents shown or given to Commission staff during *ex parte* meetings are

deemed to be written *ex parte* presentations and must be filed consistent with rule 1.1206(b). In proceedings governed by rule 1.49(f) or for which the Commission has made available a method of electronic filing, written *ex parte* presentations and memoranda summarizing oral *ex parte* presentations, and all attachments thereto, must be filed through the electronic comment filing system available for that proceeding, and must be filed in their native format (*e.g.*, .doc, .xml, .ppt, searchable .pdf). Participants in this proceeding should familiarize themselves with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.
