PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED FOR COMMENTS
ON AT&T'S MOTION FOR RECLASSIFICATION
AS A NON-DOMINANT CARRIER FOR
INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

On October 12, 1995, the Commission adopted an order in this proceeding that reclassified AT&T as a non-dominant carrier in the domestic interexchange market. (*See In the Matter of AT&T Corp. to be Reclassified as a Non-Dominant Carrier*, Order, FCC 95-427 (released October 23, 1995) (*AT&T Non-dominance Order*)). In its decision, the Commission deferred AT&T's request to be reclassified as non-dominant in its provision of international services because that category of services requires a different market analysis.

On November 8, 1995, AT&T submitted an *ex parte* letter containing updated information on its international market. AT&T states that its further submission demonstrates that it lacks power in the international telecommunications market under the Commission's applicable tests. Thus, AT&T requests that the Commission consider the updated information to support AT&T's reclassification as a non-dominant carrier in the international market.

Interested parties should file comments on AT&T's submission by **December 11, 1995**, and reply comments by **December 18, 1995**, with the Secretary, FCC, 1919 M Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20554. We do not anticipate granting any extensions of this pleading cycle.
