Application to amend blanket authorization to lease and operate satellite voice-grade bearer circuits between the United States and all overseas points.

**ORDER, AUTHORIZATION AND CERTIFICATE**

Adopted: January 18, 1996; Released: January 29, 1996

By the Chief, Telecommunications Division:

1. Upon consideration of the above-captioned uncontested application, filed by American Telephone and Telegraph Company (AT&T) pursuant to Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED that the present and future public convenience and necessity require the provision of direct service by AT&T to all the points underlined and bolded in the attached Appendix.

2. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that application File No. I-T-C-95-558 IS GRANTED, and AT&T's blanket authorizations to lease and operate satellite voice-grade circuits via appropriate INTELSAT satellites between the United States and various overseas points<sup>1</sup> are further amended and combined into the current authorization to include all points listed in the attached Appendix.

3. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that AT&T is authorized to:

- a. lease from COMSAT and operate satellite circuits on an as needed basis up to a total of 8,773 64-kbps voice-grade circuits by year-end 2000, between appropriately licensed U.S. earth stations and INTELSAT satellites, connecting with similar circuits between the satellites and the countries listed in the Appendix, furnished by AT&T's correspondents;
- b. lease and operate necessary overseas connecting facilities; and
- c. use said facilities to provide AT&T's regularly authorized services between the United States and the points listed in the Appendix.

4. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all other terms and conditions set forth in AT&T's previously granted blanket authorizations for satellite facilities via the INTELSAT satellite system shall be incorporated herein and remain in force.

5. This order is issued under Section 0.261 of the Commission's Rules and is effective upon adoption. Petitions for reconsideration under Section 1.106 or applications for review under Section 1.115 of the Commission's Rules may be filed within 30 days of the date of public notice of this order (see Section 1.4(b)(2)).
