AN ACT

To amend paragraph (f) of section 4 of the Communications
Act of 1934.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That paragraph (f) of section 4 of the Communications Act,
4 1934, is hereby amended by adding after the words “ a chief
5 engineer and not more than three assistants ”, the words “ a
6 chief accountant and not more than three assistants ”, and
7 by adding after the words “ and the chief engineer ”, the
8 words “ and the chief accountant ”, and by adding after the
9 word “ engineers ” the word “ accountants ”; so that para-
10 graph (f) of section 4, as amended, will read as follows:
11 “(f) Without regard to the civil-service laws or the

1 Classification Act of 1923, as amended, (1) the Commission
2 may appoint and prescribe the duties and fix the salaries of a
3 secretary, a director for each division, a chief engineer and
4 not more than three assistants, a chief accountant and not
5 more than three assistants, a general counsel and not more
6 than three assistants, and temporary counsel designated by
7 the Commission for the performance of special services; and
8 (2) each commissioner may appoint and prescribe the duties
9 of a secretary at an annual salary not to exceed \$4,000. The
10 general counsel and the chief engineer and the chief ac-
11 countant shall each receive an annual salary of not to exceed
12 \$9,000; the secretary shall receive an annual salary of not
13 to exceed \$7,500; the director of each division shall receive
14 an annual salary of not to exceed \$7,500; and no assistant
15 shall receive an annual salary in excess of \$7,500. The
16 Commission shall have authority, subject to the provisions
17 of the civil-service laws and the Classification Act of 1923,
18 as amended, to appoint such other officers, engineers, ac-
19 countants, inspectors, attorneys, examiners, and other em-
20 ployees as are necessary in the execution of its functions."
