To amend the Communications Act of 1934 to authorize, in certain cases, the issuance of licenses to noncitizens for radio stations on aircraft and for the operation thereof.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That section 303 (1) of the Communications Act of 1934
4 is amended by inserting immediately before the semicolon
5 at the end thereof the following: “, except that in issuing
6 licenses for the operation of radio stations on aircraft the
7 Commission may, if it finds *that* the public interest will be
8 served thereby *and that security considerations have been*
9 *satisfied*, waive the requirement of citizenship in the case of
10 persons holding United States pilot certificates issued by

1 the Civil Aeronautics ~~Commission~~ *Administration*, or in the
2 case of persons holding foreign aircraft pilot certificates
3 which are valid in the United States on the basis of reciprocal
4 agreements entered into with foreign governments”.

5 SEC. 2. Subsection (a) of section 310 of the Communi-
6 cations Act of 1934 is amended by adding at the end thereof
7 the following new paragraph:

8 “Notwithstanding paragraph (1) of this subsection, a

10 may be granted to and held by a person who is an alien
