NOTICE OF UNLICENSED OPERATION

Case Number: EB-FIELDSCR-18-00026127

On March 24, 2018, Agents from the Miami Office of the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's or Commission's) Enforcement Bureau (Bureau) confirmed by direction finding techniques that radio signals on frequency 90.1 MHz were emanating from your residence located on Northeast 148th Street in Miami, Florida. Florida property records indicate that you are the owners of this property. The Commission's records show that no license was issued for operation of a radio station at this location on 90.1 MHz in Miami, Florida.

Radio stations operating on a range of frequencies,¹ including 90.1 MHz, must be licensed by the FCC pursuant to Section 301 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (Act).² The only exception to this licensing requirement is for certain transmitters using or operating at a power level that complies with the standards established in Part 15 of the Commission's rules.³ On March 24, 2018, Agents made field strength measurements of the signal on frequency 90.1 MHz which exceeded the maximum permitted level of 250 microvolts per meter (μ V/m) at 3 meters for non-licensed devices. Thus, this station is operating in violation of Section 301 of the Act.⁴

You are hereby warned that operation of radio transmitting equipment without a valid radio station authorization constitutes a violation of the Federal laws cited above and will subject the operator to severe penalties, including, but not limited to, *in rem* seizure of the offending radio equipment without further notice, substantial fines, and criminal sanctions including imprisonment.⁵

UNLICENSED OPERATION OF THIS RADIO STATION MUST BE DISCONTINUED IMMEDIATELY AND MUST NOT RESUME.

Your response should be sent to the address in the letterhead and reference the listed case number. This will include any information that you disclose in your reply.
