




#### Promise of Broadband Internet

# **Goal of Research**

- Research the acceptance and use of broadband Internet among minorities
- Create a longitudinal database to analyze the Internet profile of minorities
- First data set to statistically compare minorities, African-Americans and Hispanics, with the general population




# Methodology

- Partnered with Princeton Survey Research Associates International
- Conducted bilingual survey between December 2009 and January 2010
- Survey of 2,741 respondents
- Over-sampled African-Americans and Hispanics
- Supplemented with field research in Chicago,

San Francisco and East St. Louis II



#### Factors Influencing Whether Individuals Will Use and Accept Broadband Internet













# **Education Profile for Broadband**








# Age Profile for Broadband


- Large gap in adoption of broadband Internet adoption by age
- Seniors left far behind






#### The Promise of Broadband is Challenging

- Minorities are overrepresented as newcomers to the Internet
- Heavy dependency on public access points to the Internet to access media rich content
- Increased reliance for jobs and government services
- Non-adopters unaware of availability of broadband Internet services locally


# Job Search by Income and Race




#### Job Search by Education and Race

# Summary

- Promise of broadband Internet is tempered
