RE: Amateur license WA2HYO repeater operations; Case #EB-2007-3045

Dear Mr. Cranston:

Enclosed is a complaint from the licensee of coordinated repeater WA3BXW alleging that your repeater is operating without coordination and causing interference to WA3BXW on 147.345 MHz. The complaint indicates that you were contacted about this problem in 2003, and contacted repeatedly since then, but that it remains unresolved.

Section 97.205 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 97.205, states that where there is interference between a coordinated and an uncoordinated repeater, "the licensee of the uncoordinated repeater has primary responsibility to resolve the interference". Section 308(b) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. Section 308(b), gives the Commission the authority to request information from a licensee regarding the operation of a radio station. Accordingly, you are requested to respond to this letter within 20 days from the above date, furnishing the following information.

- 1). Is your repeater WA2HYO coordinated for operation on 147.345 MHz? If so:
 - a). Furnish a copy of the coordination document.
 - b). State the circumstances, if any, under which you are operating the repeater in a manner not consistent with the coordination, including changed location or power.
- 2). If your repeater WA2HYO is not coordinated, or if it is coordinated but is not being operated in accordance with the coordination, state what, if any, action you have taken to obtain coordination or bring the station back into compliance with your coordination.
- 3). Have you received complaints regarding the operation of the WA2HYO repeater on 147.345 MHz? If so:
 - a). State the details of the complaints, if they were oral, and state what action, if any, you took to resolve them.
 - b). If the complaints were in writing, state what action, if any, you took in response to the complaints and furnish a copy of each complaint.

4). Describe in detail the configuration of the WA2HYO repeater system, including all sites, links and addresses, using diagrams where necessary. Detail any changes in location since the coordination, if any, was issued.

We are required to advise you that Congress has made punishable a willfully false or misleading reply to a letter of this type. See Title 18, § 1001 of the United States Code. The information you submit will be used to determine what, if any, action to take in this matter.

Please be advised that failure to resolve this interference problem will result in enforcement action against your license and may include removal of automatic control privileges from your repeater, pursuant to 97.109(d) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 97.101(d), in which case your repeater could not be operated unless you were present at the control point at all times.
