Form 477 data are growing in importance

- Primary data collection tool for broadband and voice data for the Commission
- Use data from this collection to inform policymaking and to provide information to the public and to Congress; for example in the annual Broadband Progress Report to Congress
- There are proposals to rely on data gathered from Form 477 for disbursements of USF support going forward

Why this focus on Form 477 data

We believe the Commission should base its policy making on timely and reliable data

Who must file?

Provider types

Broadband (parts I, VI)

All facilities-based providers of data service at least 200 kbps in at least one direction, whether they...

- Own networks
- Obtain network access via UNEs, special access or other leased facilities
- Provide service using either licensed or unlicensed wireless

Fixed voice (part II, V)

- Local exchange providers
- Interconnected VoIP providers

Mobile telephony (part III)

Facilities based providers of mobile telephony, whether they...

- Hold a license for the spectrum
- Obtained the right to use the spectrum via lease or other arrangement with a Band Manager

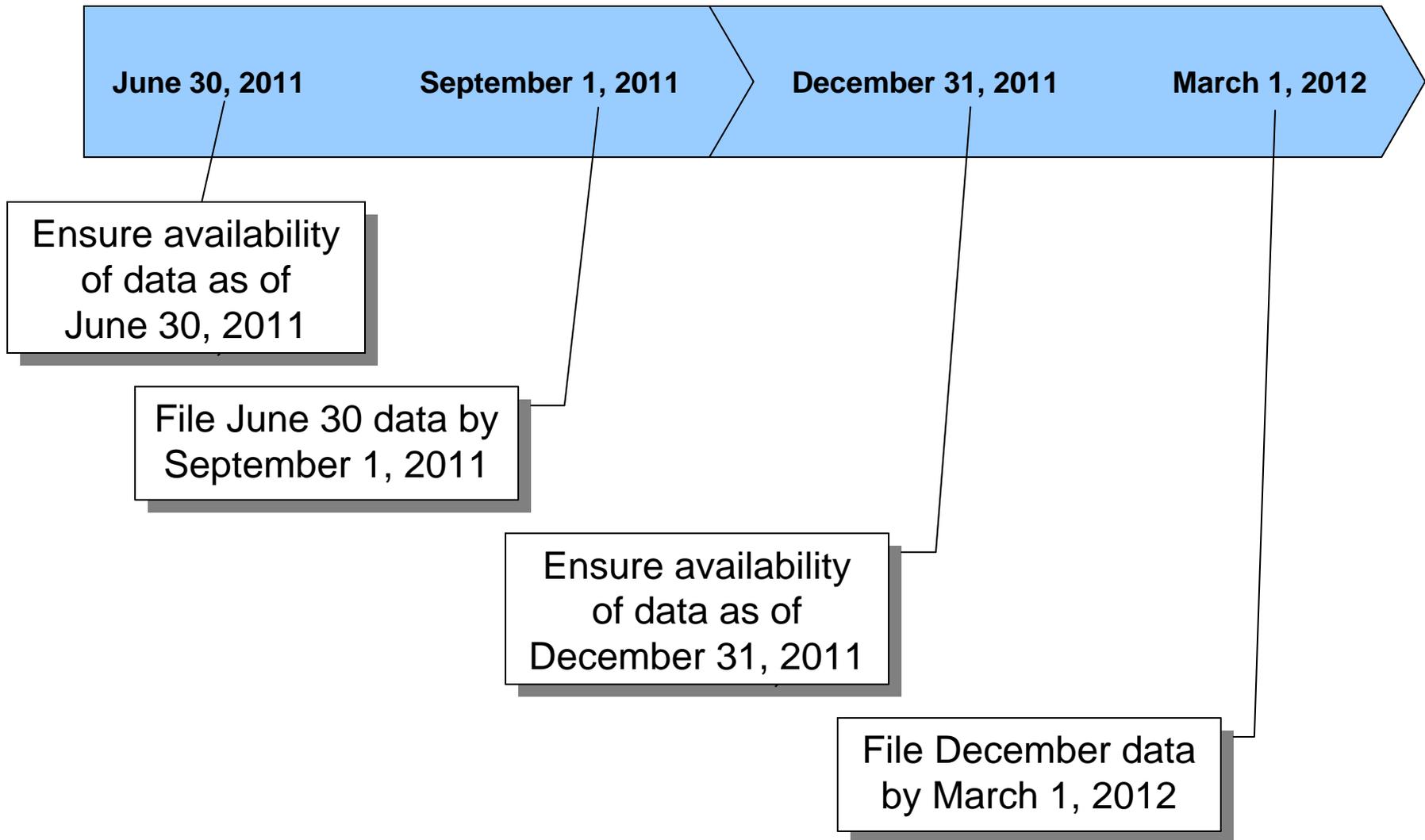
Examples include

- Fixed telco providers
- Mobile telco providers
- Cable providers
- WISPs
- Satellite companies
- Municipal ISPs

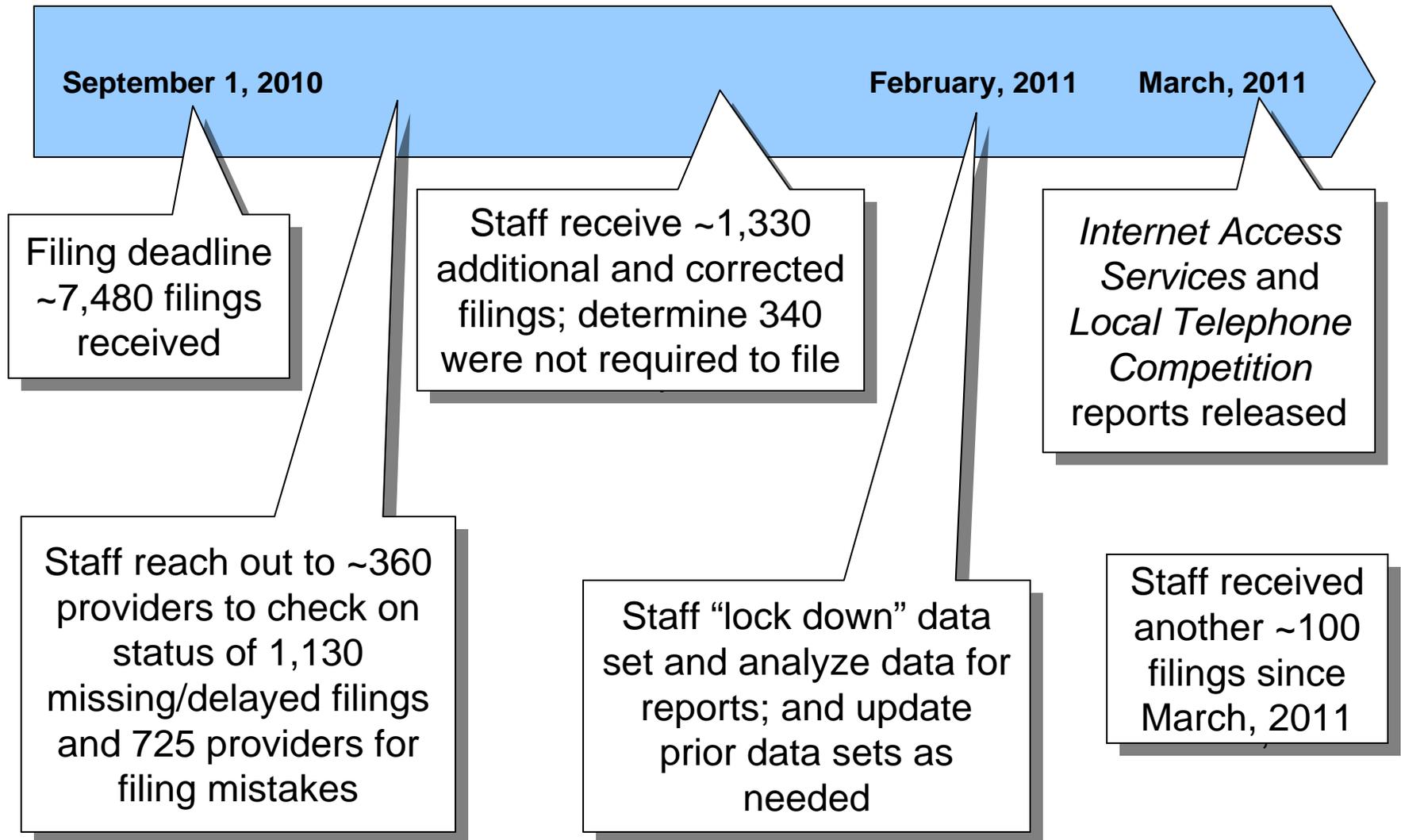
- Telephone companies
- Cable companies offering VoIP service
- Over-the-top providers of interconnected VoIP service

- Mobile phone providers

What are the important dates?



Data quality and timing strongly related



Problems we've seen

	What we see	Impact
Missing deadlines	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Providers not filing at all – there are approximately 650 providers who filed data with SBDD grantees who are not filing data with the FCC• Frequently providing incorrect data on-time and correcting later	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Delays creation of a complete data set• Requires time and effort to chase down those not filing
Improper certification	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Not having an official of the provider certify the data are correct along with their contact information	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Prevents us from identifying whether anomalies in data are errors• Prevents us from fixing any errors
Repeated mistakes	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Filing incorrect data – e.g., putting every subscriber into one census tract in a county – in each filing cycle• Moving back to “incorrect” data filings after working with FCC staff to correct in prior filing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Requires time and effort to chase down corrected data• May lead to problems in data set
