Dear Rear Admiral Simpson,

The attached survey response outlines data from the State of Ohio. Considering the information in your requesting letter, as well as your presentation to NASNA, Ohio made efforts to provide the best available data to the FCC in this response. Ohio is currently involved in a statewide PSAP consolidation effort, rules-making process and has recently created the Ohio 9-1-1 Program Office. Although a complete data set is not yet available, plans are already underway for an in-state annual report from all county 9-1-1 systems and next year's data should be much more comprehensive.

In an effort to assist the FCC in understanding the current make-up and operation of Ohio's PSAPs, the questionnaire was completed from a state program perspective. Additionally, a spreadsheet is attached which provides details from participating counties and their specific funding and fee models. Considering the wide variety of approaches, after review of the data, any questions can be sent to the Ohio 9-1-1 Program Office and our staff will follow-up with the individual county to secure a response.
