To implement the obligations laid out in the FTC-AOL Time Warner consent decree:

Prior to offering cable modem service to its own cable television subscribers,

AOL Time Warner shall enter into a contract with at least one local and one regional ISP in each franchise area in which cable modem service is made available by AOL Time Warner or any of its affiliates.

A local ISP is defined as an ISP (1) which has subscribers within the franchise area, and (2) with a majority of its customers located within the metropolitan statistical area (MSA) in which the franchise is located.

A regional ISP is defined as an ISP (1) which has subscribers within the franchise area and (2) with a majority of its customers located within no more than three metropolitan statistical areas contiguous with the MSA in which the franchise is located.

In the event that there are no local ISPs in a franchise area, contracts with two regional ISPs shall be executed.

In the event there are no regional ISPs in a franchise area, contracts with two local ISPs shall be executed.
