

Dear Commissioner Tristani:

At the FCC's en banc hearing held on Thursday, July 27, 2000, you requested Time Warner Cable to provide statistics regarding the number of subscribers of Hispanic origin it serves. Time Warner does not maintain data regarding the ethnicity of its subscriber base. Indeed, Time Warner believes it would be inappropriate to require subscribers to provide such information.

In an effort to be responsive to your request, Time Warner has estimated the number of its cable subscribers that are of Hispanic origin through the use of 1990 Census data. First, Time Warner identified the Metropolitan Statistical Areas ("MSAs") in which its various divisions are located and determined the percentage of persons in each of those MSAs that were of Hispanic origin per the 1990 Census. In the few cases where a Time Warner division either was not located in a MSA or the applicable MSA covered too great an area to provide a realistic estimate, Time Warner obtained 1990 Census data relating to the Hispanic population in the county served by the applicable Time Warner division. Next, Time Warner multiplied the number of its subscribers in each division by the percentage of the population in the relevant MSA (or county)



that was of Hispanic origin as of the 1990 Census. The resulting figures set forth on the attached chart provide an estimate of the number of Time Warner subscribers in each division that are of Hispanic origin.

Time Warner has no reason to believe that its subscriber base does not reflect the general population characteristics of the communities served. Indeed, Time Warner follows a strict anti-redlining policy, in full compliance with Section 621(a)(3) of the Communications Act. Consistent with this policy, in implementing the Memorandum of Understanding relating to multiple ISP choice, Time Warner will insist that any ISP agreement requires that such ISP's high-speed Internet service be made available throughout the applicable cable system's service area.
