PETITION FOR REVIEW

Pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 402(a), 28 U.S.C. §§ 2342(1) and 2344, and Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 15(a), Consumer Federation of America, Consumers Union and Center for Digital Democracy ("Petitioners"), petition this Court for review of a November 6, 2002 order of the Federal Communications Commission, *Order, Applications for Consent to the Transfer of Control of Licenses from Comcast Corporation and AT&T Corp., Transferors, to AT&T, Transferee*, MB Docket 02-70, FCC 02-301 (rel. Nov. 6, 2002). Venue in this Court is proper pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2343. This order denied Petitioners' *Motion to Provide Information Material to Consideration of Application to Transfer Control of Licenses*. A copy the *Order* is attached hereto, along with the dissenting opinion of Commissioner Michael Copps.

Petitioner seeks review of the FCC's action on the grounds that it is contrary to law, contrary to Commission precedent and is otherwise arbitrary and capricious, an abuse of discretion, or contrary to law. Petitioner requests that this Court hold unlawful, vacate, enjoin, and set aside the


Order, and order such other relief as may be just.
