I have great concern regarding the COMCAST Corporation acquiring AT & T Corporatins cable TV unit. I do not think we can afford any less competition.

Comcast would like all to believe that with less competiton the cost would not increase further.

I would like to cite my own situation with Comcast:
May 15, 2000for STANDARD AND SENIOR BASIC, total charge \$30.03,not including any tax or fee. Current charge to pay for STANDARD AND SENIOR BASIC, not including any tax or fees \$37.84. Total additional charge over two years \$7.81 for an increase of 26%, per month.

Comcast tells its customers that they have added additional channels, hoping to justify the increases with their subscribers. The additional channels they have added I could care less if they did not exist.

They also offer Digital service which starts at \$9.95 additional per month and can cost as much as \$4895 plus extras per month.

I like many other citizens couldn,t begin to afford as a senoir.

I would appreciate your consideration of my and other senior citizens circumstances and not approving the elimination of the competition in the take over of AT&T Cprp!s cable TV. We do not have any cable TV competition now and if approved who will try to compete with the third largest cable operator with over 22 million aubacribers..
