Dear Chairman Powell:


I am writing regarding the proposed merger between DirecTV and EchoStar. It is my understanding that this merger must be reviewed by both the Federal Communications Commission and the Department of Justice before it may proceed.

The review process is critical to ensuring any merger of this magnitude does not carry with it unintended consequences. In particular, I am concerned about affordable access to television signals in rural America. This proposed merger between DirecTV and EchoStar will be very important to many of my constituents in South Dakota. South Dakotans, like other Americans, depend on television for important news, weather, community information, and programming.

Several issues must be examined before it can be determined whether this proposed merger is beneficial or harmful to South Dakotans who receive television programming via satellite dishes. I cannot stress enough how important it is for you to consider the impact this merger would have on rural Americans before you make a decision to grant or deny a merger application.

Rural Americans deserve the same access and programming choices that are available in urban areas at a fair and reasonable price. I will continue to monitor action on this merger to ensure South Dakota's rural interests are fully considered when a decision is made by the FCC.

Thank you for your careful review of this matter, and I look forward to your response.
