This is not a letter of support, we are part of unserved rural Arizona. Affordable Internet access is not \$600+ for equipment and installation and \$70+ for monthly service, this is not affordable. In order to get a phone line to our home, the local phone company wants to charge \$10,000 to run a landline 3/4 of a mile. Our interests in rural Arizona would, I feel, be better served by more competition, not less! We need more companies to compete for our business. We have no choice for a landline phone. We should not be required to pay for their capital improvements and then have them charge us for their service. There is no competition. Please, let there be competition in the Internet satellite market. Thanks
