EXHIBIT 2

DECLARATION

I, Bert Medina, General Manager of Univision station WGB0(TV), Joliet, Illinois, hereby make the following declaration under penalty of perjury:

1. In order to be able to monitor my station's signal on the EchoStar system, I made efforts to subscribe to EchoStar's local station offerings. In these efforts, I spoke to both an EchoStar dealer and a customer service representative of EchoStar's Dish Network.
2. On January 8, 2002, I called an EchoStar dealer and asked if I could receive local Univision station WGB0(TV) on the EchoStar system. The EchoStar dealer responded, stating that WGB0(TV) was not carried by EchoStar and that no local Spanish language stations were carried by EchoStar in Chicago.
3. The dealer then proceeded to tell me that if I wanted Spanish language programming, I should purchase EchoStar's "Dish Latino 2" which carries non-local Spanish programming for an additional \$21.00 a month.
4. Knowing that EchoStar is required to carry WGB0(TV) in the Chicago market, and needing to be able to monitor the local station's signal, I again asked how I could receive local Spanish programming from EchoStar's system. The dealer once again stated that no local Spanish programming was available on EchoStar's Chicago system, and told me that in order to receive local Spanish stations, I would have to use a broadcast antenna separate from the EchoStar equipment.
5. Later that same day, I called the main 800 number for the EchoStar Dish Network and asked a sales representative to explain to me which stations are carried on EchoStar's system in Chicago.
6. The Dish Network representative told me that I could receive the "America's Top 100" package for \$30.99, and for an additional \$5.99, I could obtain EchoStar's "Local Package," which includes the ABC, NBC, CBS, FOX, PBS, UPN and WB stations.

The foregoing is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

EXHIBIT 3

DECLARATION

I, Larry Sands, General Manager of Univision station KUVS(TV), Sacramento, California, hereby make the following declaration under penalty of perjury:

1. In order to be able to monitor my station's signal on the EchoStar system, I made efforts to subscribe to EchoStar's local station offerings. In these efforts, I spoke to both an EchoStar dealer in the local area and a customer service representative of EchoStar's Dish Network.
2. On January 7, 2002, I called an EchoStar dealer in Sacramento and asked if I could receive Univision station KUVS(TV) on the EchoStar system. In response to my inquiry, the EchoStar dealer stated that he did not know whether KUVS(TV) was carried.
3. When I told the dealer that it was my understanding that KUVS(TV) was available from EchoStar but that a second dish was required in order to receive it, he responded that the need for a second dish "was news to him" and provided me with a number of his "boss." Unfortunately, the number he gave me turned out to be disconnected.
4. I therefore called the EchoStar Dish Network sales office and asked for EchoStar's basic package that included all of Sacramento's local stations. I also told the representative that I was particularly interested in receiving KUVS(TV), the local Univision station.
5. The EchoStar representative told me that station KUVS(TV) was not available and that the only way to obtain Univision programming was to purchase EchoStar's 'Top 60 Tier Package' which carries Univision Network programming.
6. I persisted, stating that I was sure that KUVS(TV) was in fact carried on EchoStar's Sacramento System and that I wanted the local Univision station in order to be able to view local newscasts.
7. The EchoStar representative responded that I must be mistaken, and that Univision "is not local" because it is "broadcast from Mexico and Venezuela."

The foregoing is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

EXHIBIT 4

DECLARATION

I, Jan Evans, Station Manager of Univision station WFDC(TV), Arlington, Virginia, hereby make the following declaration under penalty of perjury:

1. In order to be able to monitor my station's signal on the EchoStar system, I made efforts to subscribe to EchoStar's local station offerings. In these efforts, I spoke to EchoStar dealers in the local area on January 18, 2002, and asked if I could receive local Spanish-language station WFDC(TV) on the EchoStar system.
2. The first EchoStar dealer I called said he had not heard of station WFDC(TV) and that he was unaware of any new local Spanish-language station being carried on the EchoStar system in the Washington, D.C. market. He then told me I could receive Univision and Telemundo Network programming if I purchased EchoStar's "Latino Dos" package.
3. I then told him that according to EchoStar's website, WFDC(TV) was carried in the D.C. market on EchoStar's 61.5° satellite. He then proceeded to tell me that the station "must be on an international channel because it is on the 61.5° satellite and not the 110° satellite with all the other local stations." The dealer then said I would need a second dish to view WFDC(TV), and that I could purchase the second dish for \$99.00.
4. I then called a second EchoStar dealer in the D.C. area and asked about purchasing local Spanish-language programming, and specifically WFDC(TV)'s Telefutera network programming. He told me that EchoStar carries "lots of Spanish channels," but WFDC(TV) and Telefutera were "not on the list." When I told him that EchoStar's website indicated that WFDC(TV) was carried in the market and that a second dish was needed to view the station, he responded by stating that if I needed to buy a second dish, "it would cost \$289.00 because a different company makes it."
5. For clarification, I asked to speak to his supervisor, who recommended that if I wanted Spanish-language programming, I should buy the "Latino Package" which "carries ½ English language and ½ Spanish language programming for \$39.00 a month." When I mentioned the second dish requirement for receiving WFDC(TV), he said that I would need to buy the basic package and would also have to "spend \$99.00 for the second dish." When I told him that I understood the second dish was supposed to be free, he told me that was not the case.

The foregoing is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.



EXHIBIT 5

DECLARATION

I, Myrna Sonora, General Manager of Univision station KTVW-TV, Phoenix, Arizona, hereby make the following declaration under penalty of perjury:

1. In order to be able to monitor my station's signal on the EchoStar system, I made efforts to subscribe to EchoStar's local station offerings. In these efforts, I spoke to a customer service representative of EchoStar's Dish Network and asked if I could receive Univision station KTVW(TV) on the EchoStar system.
2. According to the EchoStar representative, EchoStar did carry KTVW(TV), but I would only be able to receive the station if I had a second dish installed. The representative went on to explain that the installation of the second dish would be free, but "only if it was purchased within 90 days" of signing on as a new EchoStar customer. I was told that after 90 days, it would cost \$99 for the second dish. The representative then told me I could order the "Dish Latino" package that includes 24 Spanish-language channels, although none of them are local.
3. That same day, I called the Dish Network Spanish-speaking sales line to verify that I would be charged for the second dish if I did not request installation within 90 days of signing up as a new customer. According to this second EchoStar representative, the second dish would only be "free until March." When I asked what the total cost for the second dish would be in March, the representative responded that he was not certain, but because separate fees would likely be required for the dish and installation, he imagined the cost for the second dish would be "caro" (expensive).

The foregoing is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.


DECLARATION

I, Steve. Giust, General Manager of Univision station KWEX(TV), San Antonio, Texas, hereby make the following declaration under penalty of perjury:

1. In order to be able to monitor my station's signal on the EchoStar system, I made efforts to subscribe to EchoStar's local station offerings. In these efforts, I spoke to a customer service representative of EchoStar's Dish Network and asked if I could receive Univision station KWEX(TV) on the EchoStar system.
2. The Dish Network representative told me he was not familiar with Univision and that he believed "it is broadcast from Mexico" and that the "only local stations carried are KSAT, KMOL, KABB, KLRN, KRRT, KENS and KBEJ." The corresponding network affiliations for these stations are ABC, NBC, FOX, PBS, WB, CBS and UPN.
3. Because I knew that EchoStar was also required to carry KWEX(TV) in San Antonio, I once again asked the Dish Network representative if he was certain that Univision station KWEX(TV) was not carried. The representative again told me that KWEX(TV) was not carried by EchoStar. He then told me that if I wanted Spanish-language programming, I could instead purchase the "Latino Dish Package for only \$19.99 a month."

The foregoing is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

DECLARATION

I, Tammy Heinen, General Manager of Univision station WUVG(TV), Atlanta, Georgia, hereby make the following declaration under penalty of perjury:

1. In order to be able to monitor my station's signal on the EchoStar system, I made efforts to subscribe to EchoStar's local station offerings. In these efforts, I spoke to both an EchoStar dealer in the local area and a customer service representative of EchoStar's Dish Network.
2. On January 9, 2002, I called an EchoStar dealer in Atlanta and asked if I could receive local Spanish language station WUVG(TV) on the EchoStar system.
3. According to the EchoStar dealer, WUVG(TV) is not carried by EchoStar in Atlanta, but if I wanted Spanish-language programming I should purchase EchoStar's "International Package."
4. I then called the main EchoStar number and asked if I could receive local station WUVG(TV) in Atlanta.
5. The EchoStar salesperson told me that WUVG(TV) is not carried by EchoStar in Atlanta because there was "a new law about local stations and WUVG requested not to be carried." That is of course false, as WUVG(TV) elected must-carry status on the EchoStar system.
