the U.S.-Luxembourg Route**

Dear Ms. Salas:

GE American Communications, Inc. ("GE Americom") hereby relinquishes its international Section 214 authority to provide international telecommunications services on the U.S.-Luxembourg route, effective immediately.

GE Americom was granted several facility-specific international Section 214 authorizations between 1985 and 1992. The authorizations granted in File Nos. ITC-87-140 and ITC-92-148 include authority that may be used to provide telecommunications services between the United States and Luxembourg.

By this letter, GE Americom relinquishes any and all authority that it may have to provide telecommunications services on the U.S.-Luxembourg route. GE Americom certifies that it does not now offer or provide, and has no record of ever having offered or provided, common carrier services on the U.S.-Luxembourg route. Therefore, there are no "affected customers" within the meaning of the Commission's international discontinuance rule, 47 C.F.R. § 63.19(a).


