ERRATUM

Released: June 4, 1991

1. On May 17, 1991, the Common Carrier Bureau released a Memorandum Opinion and Order in this docket, pertaining to service quality and infrastructure development monitoring for local exchange carriers (LECs) under price cap regulation.<sup>1</sup> That Order should be corrected in the manner described in the following paragraphs.

2. At Attachment B, pages 13 and 14, footnote 55 should be deleted in its entirety.

3. At Attachment B, page 25, the first paragraph should include the following sentence, which is inserted before the last sentence of that paragraph:

Because the disaggregation of access lines into MSA and non-MSA classifications poses separate and more difficult problems, LECs will be allowed to postpone this reporting until the June 1992 Infrastructure Report.<sup>112</sup>

<sup>112</sup> LECs filing Infrastructure Reports in June 1991 may enter "0" in the MSA and non-MSA columns for this filing. All LECs may enter "0" in the MSA/non-MSA access lines columns of Tables II and V of the quarterly reports; the eight LECs that file Infrastructure Reports will enter data in these columns of the quarterly reports beginning June 30, 1992, when the data become available in their Infrastructure Reports. (Other LECs will continue to enter "0" in those columns.)

4. The first sentence of the definition of "Carrier Links," in the Row Instructions for Infrastructure Table II, should be changed to read:

A Carrier Technology Segment (Carrier Link) is defined as a segment of the interoffice network disaggregated by technology (i.e., analog, digital) and by medium (i.e., copper, fiber, or radio).

This correction makes the definition of "Carrier Links" in the Row Instructions for Infrastructure Table II consistent with the definition in Attachment B, page 17, footnote 72.

5. The Infrastructure Table II, Column description of Call Set-Up Time should be changed to read:

For the purposes of infrastructure reporting, call set-up time is defined as the time between dialing the last digit and the response or an acknowledgment "winkback," or the acknowledgment of signal receipt, from the interexchange carrier.

This definition is consistent with the discussion at paragraphs 21 and 22 of the Order.
